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## Dear Alex Family Members Long Live the 4-day week

A big thanks to everyone who has diligently paid their school fees this year. I am eternally grateful to the Alex Family for making the payment of school fees such a high

priority in their budgets. It is your focus on this area that allows us to do what we need to for our children.

Excitement is building around our first music performance of the year. This time next week we will have the various ensembles playing in the hall and we will be running a live feed to a massive screen on the Heart balcony where you will all be able to sit in your cars on the rugby field and enjoy them without any danger of the spread of Covid-19.

We are scheduling our first sport fixtures. In order to prepare teams, we need to have practices for the whole age group. Please do what you can to accommodate us in this regard. Once we have finalised the schedule for

Our applications for Grade 8 for 2022 are now closed. We have had over 1400 applications so far. I have made offers to a number to families who have until the end of May to make a decision. We had a very high quality of applicants again this year. It has been a very frustrating experience to have to put applicants on the waiting list because I can see that they would flourish at Alex, but we simply don't have the capacity to take in more people. This demand for Alex bodes very well for the school and allows us to pick the very best applicants for Grade 8 each year.

Our collective congratulations to Ms Tracey Harris, who was elected as the chair of our SGB; to Mr Stan Liebenberg, who was elected as the deputy chair; and to Mr Quintin Levey, who was elected at the treasurer. We thank you all for being willing to hold these very important positions and we give you all our support as your carry out your role.

Please remain constantly vigilant for symptoms of Covin-19. If you child exhibits any signs or symptoms, they should remain at home until all the symptoms have abated. This applies even if there is a test scheduled for that day. Previously, we would have encouraged you to send them to school just to write the test but now we cannot afford to do that.
