Wars and rumers of wars

We face quite a lot of conflict in our world today. Devastating wars are playing out in several countries at once. It is heart-breaking to see the enormous amount of pain and suffering that people inflict on other people. We hold all the people who are facing these conflicts in our thoughts and prayers. Hoping that sanity will prevail and some end to the suffering can be found.

We faced our own small crisis this week when we became the target of a cyberattack. The perpetrators only seemed to be motivated by money. They initiated a ransomware programme that encrypts all the data on a hard drive and locks it up. If we pay the ransom, they promise to send the key to unlock. The software was initiated by one of our teachers clicking on a link in an email that seemed legitimate to them. It then infected the local hard drive and started moving through the network to our servers, locking all our servers and our backup servers up tight.

On Tuesday the same perpetrators took control of a server in the USA and used it to send so much data to our network that our server was unable to send any other data. It is like spraying someone in the face with a fire hose and asking them to talk to you. That is why none of you could get through to us on the phone on Tuesday. We managed to isolate the server and inform its owners, who then fixed the problem. The perpetrators then made several other attempts to remote control devices in the network, looking for a weak point.

We have managed to immunise all our devices against further spread. None of our finance or parent and pupil information was affected by the attack. These two sets of data have added layers of protection. We were lucky that they were not able to overcome those.

Our network is now safe from this particular piece of software. There could be new variants that could be modified in the future, that could make us vulnerable again.

We are not going to pay anyone. We are working with some forensic experts to see what we can do to recover the lost data. It might be the case that we have lost it for good and we will need to work hard to create it again.

We have learned a few life lessons in the process of being attacked. These may be helpful to you. Many businesses have been attacked in the city in a similar way, possibly by the same group or related groups as they seem to share the same attack strategy and similar software.

The attack came via an email, opened on the outlook application installed on a windows computer. We would have been safe if the person had been using the office 365 app for outlook inside a web browser.

Don't click on links, unless you are very sure that you can trust the sender. They have impersonated a bank, a magistrate, issuing a summons, a payroll, sending a payslip, SARS refunds and other, very convincing simulations.

Rather store your shared files in cloud storage solutions like OneDrive and Google Drive and similar. Local mapped network drives caused us a lot of damage.

If you can get your completed backups off the network by unplugging the backup server when not using it. If you can fit your personal data onto an external drive that stays unplugged, it will be safe from such an attack.

There is very little impact on the day to day running of the school, teachers are generating what they have lost as they need it, many teachers had already migrated to cloud storage and were not affected. Finances are safe and our administration data is safe.

We had a fantastic day out at the Oval on Monday during our Inter-House Athletics competition. My thanks to everyone who managed to join us for the day. A bit of early rain could not manage to dampen the spirit of the day.

My thanks to parents who were able to join us for grade meetings this week. It was wonderful to be able to spend a bit of time with you.

We invite you all to our academic awards assembly on Monday 12 February at 08H15. The names of the award winners are at the bottom of this newsletter. Academic achievement badges will be handed out at Grade assemblies on Friday next week. Grade assemblies are internal affairs and parents and guardians are not invited, but we love you all anyway. The names of the academic achievement badge winners will be published in next Friday's newsletter.

We are approaching our SGB elections in March this year. The School Governing Body is an essential part of the success of every state school. The SGB has members from the parent community, the pupils, the teaching and non-teaching staff and school management. They form the governance structure of the school.
