I have written a separate letter, distributed below this one. The tone is a little more severe, addressing the use and possibly abuse of social media by some of our children. I have had a few parents contact me to ask when Alex is going back to full capacity. It does seem rather contradictory that we are allowed to play contact sport, but we still

need to maintain a social distance of at least 1m for the rest of the time. Under the current Disaster Management Act, we are compelled to maintain our Covid related protocols, including the social distance. We have made special arrangements to allow our Matrics to return at full capacity, but it has required the use of lots of extra resources. We do not have the resources to make the same allowances for all our grades. There is discussion at national level about a return to 100%.



## **Sensible use of digital media**

We strive to teach ethical and moral behaviour. This is often difficult to govern in the spheres of social media but there are some extremely important rules of which we must be reminded regularly.

If we send messages of the following nature over WhatsApp, any other messaging system or social media platform, we could be held criminally liable:

1. Threatening or inciting violence against other people.
2. Threatening to cause harm or damage to any person or property.
3. Sending or sharing intimate pictures or videos of ourselves or another people without their consent.
4. Distributing copyright-protected images or videos.
5. Cyber-bullying, harassing or encouraging a person to harm themselves.
6. False communication intent on causing mental harm.

The law states that both the creator (if underage) and/or the sharer of an intimate image or video is considered to be committing an offence. Therefore, if we receive an intimate image, video, or similar media over WhatsApp, or any other platform, and forward it to others without the consent of the person identified, we would be guilty of an offence.

It is also important to remember that there are laws which govern groups on WhatsApp and other messaging platforms. If we are on a messaging group and images, videos or messages which break the above laws are shared, we could be found guilty of an offence if we do not

1. Immediately leave the group.
2. Report the offence to the relevant authorities.

It is of the utmost importance that we protect ourselves by knowing and understanding the law governing social media. Criminal cases are being opened against people for sharing information that they do not have permission to share.

Parents, please take note of the fact that if your child's cell phone is on contract under your name then you could be held liable for inappropriate images or messages on that phone. Any intimate photos or videos of underage children is classified as child pornography and anyone, including other children, who has those images or videos on their phones or who shares them on social media can be prosecuted accordingly.

Social media can be an excellent tool for education, communication and collaboration when used correctly. It does, unfortunately, come with a series of new risks that we need to understand in order to prevent.

Please guard yourselves and your loved ones.
