Ms Smit was the teacher in charge of our quiz team that won the Herald general knowledge quiz last year. We start next term on Tuesday 5 April. The protocol relating to the logistics is as follows:

- 11. Your behaviour on the buses must be as for normal school activities no initiation or other behaviour problems
- 12. You are not allowed to wear civvies at any time on Saturday
- 13. During the morning, you must stay at York and watch sport until the last fixture has been played.
- 14. You may NOT leave the school with anyone during the morning this includes your parents
- 15. Report to the same bus immediately after the last match has been completed
- 16. If you are going home with your parents, or someone else's parents, you must give a letter, written and signed by your parents, to the teacher in charge of your bus
- 17. If you experience any problems during the day, you must find Mr Meyer or Dr McGregor
- 18. The buses will leave George at approximately 14:30pm
- 19. Buses will return to Alex and pupils must be fetched from Alex.
