Enjoy the Silence

I hope that you all enjoyed the respite last week, with no newsletter from my desk, you had one less email to catch up on. I spent my weekend replying to emails from parents to whom I had to send an email, telling them that their child's application for Grade 8 in 2026 has been placed on a waiting list. I thought it might be useful to explain to everyone a little more about the process, as most of you did not get an email like that from me on your way into Alex.

You may have friends or relatives who have such an email from me and they may be frustrated or angry. Please tell them to simply reply to that email. I will respond, even if it takes more that 24 hours. We have just topped 1000 applications for grade 8 next year. We still have just under 5 weeks to go before the applications close. I have made just over 200 offers to applicants at the top of the waiting list. I will be making more offers in March, once I have heard back from everyone who has received an offer.

The admissions policy is our guiding document. I adhere strictly to that policy in order to avoid any subjective decision making. If you still know of anyone who would like to apply for Grade 8 at Alex in 2026, please encourage them to get the application started.

It is a very anxiety causing time for any parent of a Grade 7 in this City. We treat every application with dignity and compassion. It is well understood in the admissions committee the impact that being put on the waiting list has on the child. We do not take that decision lightly. We are also faced with offering only 20% of applicants a place every year, which we know is hard on families.

Early departures

If you need to fetch your child early from school and you know about it before hand. Please send the information to the register teacher. that the reception office needs to be notified of their departure. They also need to be booked out of class. If we only find out that you are at school to fetch them when you arrive, there could be quite a delay in finding them and getting them signed out. Please help us in this regard.
