# Dear Alex Family Members Start the Term with a Bang

We seldom start a term on a Monday, this term was the exception. I enjoyed the company of those of you who attended our Cultural Awards Assembly on Tuesday. #### **Exams Preparations**

We have published the exam timetable. Please check to see that your child has one. The front page has an empty table that is intended for them to extract their personal timetable from the whole document. Detailing the start time of each exam. Please could I ask that you check the front page once they have completed it. Please make sure that they have not missed an exam. Check the start time for each paper to ensure that the detail is correct.

All of them should be in possession of a scope for each subject that details the exact topics that are to be covered in each question paper. Please also ensure that your child has one for every subject. There have been a lot of absentees lately and it is possible that on the day the scope was handed out that your child was away from school.

They need to have the scope and the exam timetable to ensure that their exam revision schedule can be constructed and followed. Grade 8s and 9s may still be getting homework in some subject, which should be taking up to 90 minutes per evening. There should be at least another 90 minutes of revision on at least 4 days per week and possible one session over the weekend.

From the 27<sup>th</sup> of November all classes will stop and they will have time in the day to add revision time. Please supervise the structure of this time. If they don't have a plan they will easily waste a whole day by dithering.

For seniors, there should be between two and four hours per week day of homework and / or revision and at least another four to five hours over the weekend.

These are just guidelines some people need more time and some need less. I am confident that you can tell that is required.
